BACKGROUND

- ▶ GOALS AND TARGETS WHICH ARE: TIME-BOUND AND MEASUREABLE
- ▶ AIMED TO COMBAT: (i) POVERTY; (ii) HUNGER; (iii) DISEASE; (iv) ILLITERACY; (v) ENVIRONMENTAL DEGRADATION; (vi) DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN

MILLENNIUM GOALS

1. ERADICATE EXTREME POVERTY AND HUNGER;
2. ACHIEVE UNIVERSAL PRIMARY EDUCATION;
3. PROMOTE GENDER EQUALITY AND EMPOWER WOMEN;
4. REDUCE CHILD MORTALITY;
5. IMPROVE MATERNAL HEALTH;
6. COMBAT HIV/AIDS, MALARIA AND OTHER DISEASES;
7. ENSURE ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY;
8. DEVELOP A GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP FOR DEVELOPMENT.

TARGETS AND INDICATORS

TARGETS

- GL 1:**
- 1. Halve between 1990 and 2015 the proportion of people whose income is less than \$US1 per day;**
 - 2. Halve, between 1990 to 2015, the proportion of people who suffer from hunger**

INDICATORS

- 1. Proportion of population below \$1 per day;**
- 2. Poverty gap ratio [incidence x depth of poverty];**
- 3. Share of poorest quintile in national consumption**
- 4. Prevalence of underweight children (under 5 years old)**
- 5. Proportion of population below minimum level of dietary energy consumption**

TARGETS AND INDICATORS (cont'd)

TARGETS

GL 2:

3. Ensure that, by 2015, children everywhere, boys and girls alike, will be able to complete a full course of primary schooling

INDICATORS

6. Net enrolment ratio in primary education;
7. Proportion of pupils starting grade 1 who reach grade 5;
8. Literacy rate of 15-24

TARGETS AND INDICATORS

(cont'd)

TARGETS

GL 3: 4. Eliminate gender disparity in primary and secondary education preferably by 2005 and to all levels of education no later than 2015.

INDICATORS

9. Ratio of girls to boys in primary, secondary and tertiary education;

10. Ratio of literate females to males 15-24 year olds;

11. Share of women in wage employment in the non-agricultural sector;

12. Proportion of seats held by women in national parliament.

TARGETS

GL 4:

5. Reduce by two-thirds, between 1990 and 2015, the under-five mortality rate

INDICATORS

13. Under-five mortality rate;

14. Infant mortality rate;

15. Proportion of 1 year old children immunized against measles

TARGETS AND INDICATORS (cont'd)

TARGETS

GL 5:

6. Reduce by three quarters, between 1990 and 2015, the maternal mortality ratio

INDICATORS

16. Maternal mortality ratio;

17. Proportion of births attended by skilled health personnel

TARGETS AND INDICATORS (cont'd)

TARGETS

GL 6:

7. Have halted by 2015, and begun to reverse, the spread of HIV/AIDS

INDICATORS

18. HIV prevalence among 15-24 year old pregnant women;

19. Condom use rate of the Contraceptive prevalence rate;

19 (a). Condom Use at last High Risk sex;

19 (b) Percentage of population aged 15-24 years with comprehensive correct knowledge of HIV/AIDS;

19 © Contraceptive Prevalence Rate

20. Ratio of school attendance of orphans to school attendance of non-orphans aged 10-14 years;

TARGETS AND INDICATORS (cont'd)

TARGETS

GL 6:

8. Have halted by 2015, and begun to reverse, the incidence of malaria and other major diseases

INDICATORS

- 21. Prevalence and death rates associated with malaria;**
- 22. Proportion of population in malaria risk areas using effective malaria prevention and treatment measures;**
- 23. Prevalence and death rates associated with tuberculosis;**
- 24. Proportion of TB cases detected and cured under DOTS (Directly Observed Treatment Short Course)**

TARGETS AND INDICATORS (cont'd)

GL. 7

TARGETS

10. Halve, by 2015, the proportion of people without sustainable access to safe drinking water;
11. By 2020, to have achieved a significant improvement in the lives of at least 100 million slum dwellers

INDICATORS

30. Proportion of population with sustainable access to an improved water source;
31. Proportion of people with access to improved sanitation;
32. Proportion of people with access to secure tenure

TARGETS AND INDICATORS (cont'd)

NOTE: INDICATORS 25 TO 29 AS WELL AS 33 TO 44 ARE ENVIRONMENTAL AND ECONOMIC INDICATORS

TARGETS AND INDICATORS (cont'd)

TARGETS

GL 8:

16. In co-operation with developing countries, develop and implement strategies for decent and productive work for youth
17. In co-operation with pharmaceutical companies, provide access to affordable, essential drugs in developing countries
18. In co-operation with the private sector, make available the benefits of new technologies, especially information and communications

INDICATORS

45. Unemployment rate of 15-24 year olds by Sex
46. Proportion of population with access to affordable essential drugs on a sustainable basis
47. Telephone lines and cellular subscribers per 100 people
- 48 (a) Personal computers per 100 people
- 48 (b) Internet users per 100 population
